Session 2

1. Can I be called by God?

"God calls everyone. Every single follower of Jesus will be called by God. ... Every calling is holy, is important, and is part of God's mission to heal and save the world."

Discernment

Discernment is the process of listening for and understanding God's voice.

2. Spiritual disciplines are essential to the process of discernment.

Spiritual Disciplines are God-given tools to help us learn to listen for and understand God's voice.

What is a **CALLING?**

A summons from God to do or be something for the sake of God's Kingdom.

Vocational Calling

A summons to a career or long-term commitment to a particular cause.

Situational Calling

A summons to respond to a particular situation at a particular moment.

3. Christian Community is essential to the process of discernment.

Who helps you listen for the voice of God deep inside?

Invitation to Reflection

Use these questions to guide your personal reflection and group discussions before the next session:

- What spiritual disciplines help you hear the voice of God? What spiritual disciplines do you need to begin practicing?
- Let's start the process of defining the mission statement for this season of your life. In light of Buechner's quote about calling that we discussed earlier, how are you especially moved by the world's needs? What makes your heart ache? What makes your heart sing?

Want to Dive a Little Deeper?

What do God's mission, your sense of calling, and the practice of discernment have in common? Lots! Spend some time reflecting on or discussion these questions to synthesize the first two sessions of this course.

Mission

Read Micah 6:8 and Matthew 22:36-40. How do you rate yourself in living out the mission of discipleship as described in these two passages?

Calling

The Bible is full of call stories. Check out Abraham's calling in Genesis 12, Moses' calling in Exodus 3, Isaiah's calling in Isaiah 6, Jeremiah's calling in Jeremiah 1, Jonah's calling in the book of Jonah, Mary's calling in Luke 1, and Paul's calling in Acts 9...just to name a few. What about their callings feels familiar to you? What can you learn from their choice to say "yes" to God?

What are Spiritual Gifts?

Spiritual gifts are special abilities given by God to every believer for the sake God's mission to save the world.

1. Every person who confesses Jesus is given one or more spiritual gifts through the Holy Spirit.
1. Spiritual gifts are given for the common good. God gives us spiritual gifts so that God can work through you for the good of God's Kingdom.

Spiritual Gifts are ...

1. NOT the same as natural talents.
2. NOT given to us as fully developed packages.
3. NOT something to boast about.

To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

Invitation to Reflection

Use these questions to guide your personal reflection and group discussions before the next session:

- The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Jesus that God sends to live within us and to work in the world around us. So it is the Holy Spirit who enables and equips us to carry on the ministry of Jesus. How does this statement enhance, challenge, or confirm your understanding of the Holy Spirit?
- Read Romans 12, Ephesians 4, and 1 Corinthians 12. How do these passages speak to you about what spiritual gifts are and what they are not? How do these passages enhance, challenge, or confirm your understanding of the purpose of spiritual gifts?

Session 4

Administration

The gift of administration is the God-given ability to understand what makes an organization function and the special ability to plan and execute procedures that accomplish the goals of the group or organization.

People I know with this gift...

Discernment

The gift of discernment is the God-given ability to distinguish between truth and error. It is being able to discern the difference between good and evil, right and wrong, truth and deception.

People I know with this gift...

Remember:

Spiritual gifts are special abilities given by God to every believer for the sake God's mission to save the world.

Encouragement

The gift of encouragement is the God-given ability to present words of comfort, consolation, and encouragement so as to strengthen or urge to action those who are discouraged or wavering in their faith.

People I know with this gift...

Evangelism

The gift of evangelism is the God-given ability to effectively communicate the gospel to nonbelievers so they respond in faith and move toward discipleship.

People I know with this gift...

Faith

The gift of faith is the God-given ability to act on God's promises with confidence and unwavering belief in God's ability to fulfill his purposes.

People I know with this gift...

Giving

The gift of giving is the God-given ability to contribute money and resources to the work of the Lord with cheerfulness and generosity.

People I know with this gift...

Helps

The gift of helps is the God-given ability to accomplish practical and necessary behind-the-scenes tasks, which frees up, supports, and meets the needs of others.

People I know with this gift...

Hospitality

The gift of hospitality is the God-given ability to care for people by providing friendly reception, food, and lodging.

People I know with this gift...

Invitation to Reflection

- Consider the Biblical characters mentioned in this session (Moses and Aaron, Peter, and Paul). What about their gifts inspires you? What about their gifts challenges you?
- Consider the names you wrote down of people in your life who have some of the gifts mentioned in this session. How are they using their gifts for the sake of God's mission? How can you support and encourage them?

Session 5

Intercession

The gift of Intercession is the God-given ability to consistently pray on behalf of and for others, seeing frequent and specific results.

People I know with this gift...

Knowledge

The gift of knowledge is the God-given ability to learn, analyze, and uncover insights from the Bible that are pertinent to the growth and well-being of the church.

People I know with this gift...

Remember:

Spiritual gifts are special abilities given by God to every believer for the sake God's mission to save the world.

Leadership

The gift of leadership is the God-given ability to cast vision, motivate, and direct people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God.

People I know with this gift...

Mercy

The gift of mercy is the God-given ability to feel deeply for those in physical, spiritual, or emotional need and then demonstrate actions to meet those needs.

People I know with this gift...

Prophecy

The gift of prophecy is the God-given ability to reveal God's truth and proclaim it in a timely and relevant manner for understanding, correction, repentance, or edification.

People I know with this gift...

Shepherding

The gift of shepherding is the God-given ability to assume long-term personal responsibility for the spiritual welfare of an individual or small group of Christ-followers by nurturing and guiding them toward ongoing spiritual maturity.

People I know with this gift...

Teaching

The gift of teaching is the God-given ability to understand, clearly explain, and apply the Word of God in such a way that it is clearly understood by others.

People I know with this gift...

Wisdom

The gift of wisdom is the God-given ability to apply spiritual truth effectively to meet a need in a specific situation.

People I know with this gift...

Invitation to Reflection

Use these questions to guide your personal reflection and group discussions before the next session:

- Consider again the quote from Frederick Buchner: "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." How do your gifts uniquely position or equip you to address the things you are most passionate about? What is holding you back?
- Consider your gifts. Are you surprised by your gifts? Which gifts do you feel are most developed (meaning, you are most comfortable using them)? Which gifts are your growing edges?
- Consider the names you wrote down of people in your life who have some of the gifts mentioned in this session. How are they using their gifts for the sake of God's mission? How can you support and encourage them?

How to Write a Personal Mission Statement

Step 1 - Considering what you've learned about God's Kingdom, describe/list how you are most eager to see "thy kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven?"

Step 2 - Define the kind of person you want to be: values, integrity, etc. Consider all aspects of your identity: spouse, friend, parent, employee, employer, etc.


Step 3 - Define the legacy you hope to leave as a result of this season of life. Write down every role, and define how you wish to be remembered.

Step 4 - Explore your gifts: What are the gifts and skills that are most important to you, that you enjoy the most?

Step 5 - Considering all of that you've already process in steps 1-4, what goals do you have for the future?

SMART Goals are Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, Time-Bound

Step 6 - Craft your mission statement in 1-2 sentences

Want to Dive a Little Deeper?

To dive deeper into the Explore, Experiment, Examine process, discuss in a small group or reflect in your journal about these questions:

Explore...

What was affirming for you when you received your gifts results? What was surprising?

Experiment...

What kinds of things do you want to try next considering your gifts? How do your gifts clarify your experience with ways you are already serving, whether they are life-giving or not?

Examine...

What kind of service have I been part of that has "felt right" or felt fulfilling? Does faithful service always have to be fulfilling or "feel right"? In those seasons when it feels life-draining and hard, does that mean I'm not serving faithfully?
